	The panel introductions given and Chair's update.					
	Brexit talks still in limbo and a no deal seems likely.					
	 Government Campaign no mention of previous acknowledged dangers from a no deal Brexit including shortage of fuel, food, medicine. 					
	 Two thirds of companies are less prepared for a no deal Brexit than they were a year ago and have yet to make any preparations for such an outcome. 					
	 Medicines – the pharmaceutical industry have warned the government there are some stockpile of the medicine supplies earmarked for Brexit however, these have now been used up for patients suffering from Covid 19. Covid 19 pandemic has made issues worse and the low stockpile may not withstand a no deal Brexit and a second wave of the virus. 					
	 Settlement scheme shows 3.7 million applications to the scheme and 3.4 million applications have been concluded up until the end of June 2020. 57% granted settled status and 41% granted pre-settled status.

	more outreach surgery money. 7 offices joined forces from North and North West of London. The joint bid is for more coverage and due to cross border clients. Delivering same level of services reaching the more vulnerable, religious establishments and schools from October. Also, the elderly people from the Italian community and some of the Roma community. Trying to raise awareness. Libraries have opened. Liaising with Lee regarding when CAB can go back into the libraries, all by appointment. Expect to hear back in September whether we have been successful in this bid. If successful we can take on one full time person and two volunteers depending on demand. That is the main Enfield bid gone in by the deadline.

Risk Register Health Check – Meeting to discuss BR3 – Civil Unrest

Civil unrest – from the Brexit Risk Register Andrea suggested looking at BR3 civil unrest. Partly to do with Brexit but also includes other risks, i.e. protests counter protests, unlicensed music events, increase in reports in hate crime during June. Covid 19 related unemployment which will impact on young people and low paid service jobs and additional demands on public services.

Unlicensed music events in Enfield - one stopped in Jubilee Park and one last night in College Gardens. Coming up on the 4 August the anniversary of Mark Duggan could also have an impact. Therefore, lots of factors police working with and Andrea thinks there is a real risk for civil unrest although not specific to Brexit it has a layered impact.

Petra agreed with Andrea's concerns and said these are things looked at on a daily basis by the Police. Police looking at the unlicensed music events, which we have had quite a few in recent weeks. If number however is too high to deal with there are contingencies centrally for additional resources to be sent to the scene, have open communication and can call on extra resources. Easing of lockdown in public events, will present itself as a challenge. Lots learnt from Brexit planning and Covid 19.

General civil unrest concerns with regards to furlough, redundancies. Hate crime increase towards police officers.

Mark Dougan anniversary - work going on around that and also liaising with central planning teams to advise and offer support.

Cllr Barnes asked how the roads are with regards to increase in speeding offences. Roads are busier however have not seen a massive increase in speeding offences. As the Government encourages people to return to work, it is interesting to see how this will impact on public transport - need to monitor to see if there is an increase in anti-social behaviour.

As we don't know what might trigger a civil unrest agreed to raise from green to amber on the Brexit Risk Register. Also agreed to raise on the Corporate Risk Register to amber.

NHS - Ailsa Bawn said they are setting up a new Brexit group in the emergency planning group. Will have more to report next month.	
Public Health - Stuart Lines said – potential of having a vaccine ready by Christmas is over optimistic. Chief medical officer said it is more likely to be available by end of next year. The Pandemic peak that could follow may start end of December/January. We may see all the food shortages in shops yet again.	
Should there be another peak the Government position is on local lockdown rather than a complete national lockdown. Flu season may not be as bad this year because of all the social distancing.	
Citizens Advice Enfield - Nnenna Anyanwu – during the pandemic a high number of people enquiring how to access benefits, self-employed people what the furlough scheme means etc. People being made redundant or losing their jobs as the furlough scheme is coming to an end in the next couple of months and more people will be wanting to find out what their rights are. In the hospitality sector there are lots of people from Europe who may lose their jobs. To have the right to remain in the UK one of the conditions is to be employed. Nana to bring back data to next meeting. How job losses may affect the settlement scheme.
