What is the Enfield Youth Parliament?

Enfield Youth Parliament gives our young people a platform to tell the Council what issues affect them and gives us a valuable sounding board which we can use to test the water on the policies and plans that affect them.

Participation in this fantastic programme also helps give young people valuable experience in decision making, research, negotiation, leadership and debating skills, which will prove invaluable in later life as well as giving them an insight in to how government organisations work and make the decisions which affects us all. It is an important contributor to council decisions affecting Enfield's young people and its members also represent the borough at the national UK Youth Parliament and the London Youth Assembly.

To qualify to stand for election you must:

- ▶ Be aged 11-19 (or up to 25 if you have a learning difficulty or disability)
- ▶ Live, work, be educated or in training in the London Borough of Enfield
- ▶ Attend a school, college or youth centre that are taking part in the elections
